Council Supports Plan for GWOH

Items needed for Lutheran World Relief personal care kits

St. Peter's Women of the ELCA will be collecting items for personal care kits during September and through October. A Thrivent Grant was applied for, received, and used to purchase the bath-size towels, so these are the remaining items needed to fill the Lutheran World Relief personal care kits:

- **Bath-size bars of soap** (4-5 oz.) any brand, in original wrapping
- **Sturdy combs**, (wide tooth preferred) remove packaging
- **Adult-size toothbrushes**, in original packaging; *multi-packs of toothbrushes may also be donated
- **Metal nail clippers**, (attached file optional) remove packaging

You may purchase any LWR kit items at any time that you find a special price. Complete listing of all the kits and required kit items are found on page 33 of the 2018 St. Peter's Church Yearbook or pick up the "Supplies for LWR Kits" page on the table by the closet between the narthex and fellowship hall. Please place all kit items in the plastic container by this closet.

Money may also be designated for purchasing kit items or for shipping. When using an offering envelope, please designate "LWR kits" or "LWR shipping fund" on the envelope. If there are questions regarding Lutheran World Relief donations or kit items, please contact Linda Dornburg, Lutheran World Relief coordinator for St. Peter's Women of the ELCA.

Reminders for St. Peter's Women of the ELCA

- Our next Lutheran World Relief quilting workday will begin at 9am on September 19. We have a goal to make more quilts than we made last year, which was 111 quilts. We have a very good start with a few over 70 quilts completed. We will be sharing "stone soup" for the noon meal at the September 19 workday. Please join us!
- Southwestern Texas Synodical Women's Convention will be held September 28—30, 2018, at Pearl Hotel, South Padre Island. Remember that the "pop tops" that are being collected will be given during this convention. So please, remember to turn in all "pop tops" by September 23. The physical offering at the convention is gift cards—Walmart, Target, HEB, gas cards, etc. These cards will be given to La Posada, a ministry for people in crisis from around the world, who are seeking legal refuge in this country. If you want to donate a card, please speak to Kathy Albrecht, the WELCA convention voting delegate.
- Remember to bring any school kit items that you have purchased for Lutheran World Relief and place them in the plastic container by the closet between the narthex and the fellowship hall by September 16. We will be moving the focus from the school kit project to the collection of personal care items this month. Last year we donated a total of 112 School Kits to LWR. We received confirmation that some of these kits were sent to Honduras. A school kit increased the chances of breaking the chains of chronic poverty and avoiding the real risk of gang involvement. Our goal is to assemble and donate more school kits this year than we gave last year.
